Our New Meeting Venue & Day

As many of you are aware we have **moved our General Meeting** to the **Greyhound Social Club at 140 Rookwood Road**, **Yagoona.** After almost 40 years at our present venue, the Council of Motor Clubs identified the need for the change, based on the reasons as set out below, and have acted on it following a majority vote.

In two past emails I outlined the reasons for the move.

"As you may be aware, the Magpie Sports Club, where we currently hold our General Meetings, has been taken over by a larger club and they have recently undertaken some renovations.

We have been advised that, at this point in time, the club will not undertake any (much needed) renovations to the function room upstairs where our meetings are held. However, there is a strong possibility that they will upgrade the facilities in the not too distant future and this may well disrupt our current arrangements."

While we had no trouble securing the venue at the Greyhound Club, we were unable to secure the Monday evening as the club closes at 8pm on Monday nights. We therefore, had to change the night to the last **Tuesday** of each alternate month. Again, please accept our apologies for any disruption to your club meetings.

The first meeting to be held at the Greyhound Social Club will be on Tuesday 27th May 2014 at 8pm. This particular meeting will, of necessity, be up a short staircase, but it is nothing like the staircase at the Magpie Sports Club and is easier to negotiate. All subsequent meetings will be held in the Ground Floor Auditorium, which is spacious and very comfortable. There is also a Bistro with Chinese and Australian meals. This will make it easier for those of you who wish to come straight from your workplace and have a meal before the meeting, and of course, to do a bit of socialising.

The Robert Shannon Foundation

The Robert Shannon Foundation was established in 2003 to perpetuate the memory of Robert Shannon, founder of Shannons Insurance, who died unexpectedly in March 2000.

Robert was an avid classic car enthusiast, who especially enjoyed his 1930 Invicta S Type. He was a strong supporter of the historic motoring movement and was concerned that it was not attracting enough younger people, particularly in the areas of the preservation and restoration of classic vehicles.

AIM

After the success of the Shannons 2001 National Motoring Tour, the Australian Historic Motoring Federation (AHMF) established the Robert Shannon Foundation. The AHMF is the national body representing classic and historic vehicle clubs in all states and territories. The purpose of the Foundation is to encourage people under the age of 30 to become involved in the restoration and preservation of veteran, vintage, post-vintage, historic 50's, historic 60' and historic 70's vehicles up to 30 years old. The Foundation may (1) help with the purchase of specialist tools or equipment; (2) assist with the actual cost of restoration work, (3)contribute toward TAFE or other fees or (4) contribute toward any project considered worthwhile by the Trustees.

ELIGIBLITY

Any person or group of people under the age of thirty years and engaged in studying automotive restoration and preservation or actively working on historic vehicles is eligible to nominate for a grant.

Before completing an application form an individual or group should seek the support of a local vehicle club. This club must be affiliated with the appropriate state council.

Bella Vista

The day started bright and early, as well as being fine, just as we like it!

The space available within the Bella Vista Historic Site suits a display of motor vehicles, with grassy cover and some shade. There was a number of stalls, both for food and crafts. For the little children, pony rides could be purchased as well as a petting enclosure for small animals. The homestead was open for those who wished to visit it and take in the well-restored heritage building.

Marques represented included: Austin, Morris, Ford, Holden, Studebaker, Hudson, Chevrolet, Daimler, Singer, Riley, Jowett, Leyland (P76), Jeep, MG, Fiat, Daimler, Rover, Wolseley, Jaguar, Swallow, Clubman, VW, Hillman, Humber, Mazda. Although both US and British marques were represented, there were many more British than others.

The outstanding car which was there, in my estimation, was the 1930 Morris Isis.

Clubs which were well represented, as well as ROC, included Austin (I think the greatest number of cars), Morris Minor Picnic Club, Jowett, Wolseley, Leyland P76 Owners.

By the time that I left, at about 1:45pm, there had been about 77 vehicles attending, a small number leaving before the day had finished. I understand that by the end of the day, more than 80 vehicles had been on show.

The Leyland P76 Owners Club, and in particular Kay and Tony De Luca, must be congratulated for a wonderful event and the smooth manner in which it was organised. A total of more than \$2500 was raised for Friends of Bella Vista, including a gold coin donation for each car on display.
