President's Report



The Shannons Sydney Classic is almost upon us. At the General Meeting on Tuesday 28th July we will be handing out the finished maps for the event, together with the Track Tours Schedule.

At this meeting we will also be asking for volunteers to help out on the Saturday, with setting up and on the Sunday to help with running the event.

We don't expect you to spend the whole day volunteering; a coupe of hours will do if you can.

We are trialling a new event for the SSC in 2015. In conjunction with the radio advertising we gave away 20 double passes to the event and a ride in a classic car. We will be looking at this becoming a regular feature of the SSC. It will depend on the success of the trial.

We were rained out last year, but over 700 cars still made it to the event. Please remember, that rain, hail or shine the event goes ahead. However, this year the long-range forecasts are saying it will be fine on the day.

Our relationship with the Honourable Duncan Gay MLC, who is the NSW Minister responsible for our interests, is very friendly and beneficial to all concerned. Duncan has attended several motoring enthusiast conferences, held by the ACMC, and has shown himself to be an enthusiast.

He appointed me to co-chair the Vehicles Standards Working Group (VSWG), which oversees the drafting and implementation of rules for vehicles in NSW. Two of our committee members, in John Lindsay and Tony O'Donnell, have also been appointed to the VSWG.

I am also a member of the Minister's Road Safety Advisory Council. This is the first time in NSW that the Classic Vehicle Movement has had any such representation and we are doing our best to ensure that it continues.

We are now involved, via the ACMC, in obtaining a set of rules for a third version of conditional registration in NSW. The main thing we are asking for is the allowance of modified vehicles onto such a third scheme. They will still have to be 30 years old but modification which would still allow normal registration in NSW will be permitted.

The main beneficiaries will be the Street Machine groups and 4WDers. Applicants will still have to be members of approved Clubs so the ACMC will be involved and all those clubs in the CMC and CHMC who are already approved can apply and link in to the new scheme straight away. It will not be automatic and the existing Historic and Street Rod CRS schemes will remain unchanged.

May I repeat that the HCRS will remain unchanged.



Our very first roundabout

In January 1888, the statue of the beloved Queen Victoria that gave the square its name was unveiled. It stood right where the people of her day would have wanted it to be – right in the middle of the circle. But within six years, the statue was circled by tram tracks laid for the new Darling Harbour to Edgecliff service. Later, covered waiting sheds were being built in a semicircle around Queen Victoria for the electric trams which took over in 1905. The tram tracks (and the statue of Queen Victoria) stayed until 1960 when buses replaced trams and the tracks were pulled up. With the tram circle gone and motor traffic increasing year by year, suddenly Queen Victoria was in the way.




The completion of the new Law Courts in 1977 was just the excuse the authorities needed to move the statue out of the way. She and her pedestal were moved to a spot outside the new Law Courts building. Ten years later, the council dug up the pavement again and placed Queen Victoria back where she was previously. Unfortunately the road had been narrowed considerably, and where she was previously was now kerbside. The statue of her beloved consort, Prince Albert, still looks across the square towards her from the opposite corner. Sadly, Queens Square is today just another intersection in the central business district, with most who drive through it oblivious to its historical significance.

77. The driver of any motor vehicle proceeding upon Queen's Square, Sydney, shall keep the vehicle upon his left-hand side of the roadway around the statue of Queen Victoria until he is opposite his left-hand side of the street he is about to enter.




Surry Hills

And then the devilish tyke,


Would stop his whittling long enough, To speak into the mike...
