President's Report

Concours

Club Chat

Number Plates - The Numbers Added Up

A leaflet came with the 2015 registration renewal for my Rolls-Royce Silver Spirit. The message was "The rules say you need number plates", "They didn't say they needed to be yellow". However, there was a time when the rules did say they needed to be yellow and that is why the Motor Transport Department took my late father, Ray Neely, to court!

Ray was a member of the Vintage Motor Club, the Vintage Sports Car Club, the Alvis Club and the Rolls-Royce Owners' Club.



Ray bought a 1923 12/50 Alvis in 1963 with its original number NSW-77-888 intact. The Department demanded the return of the plates when the registration was transferred and in their place yellow and black plates would be issued. The policy was to standardise all plates to the new yellow and black. Ray was incensed and refused. The Department threatened legal action and Ray decided to fight the case on the principle that the plates were original to the car, at first not knowing if there was a legal basis for his stand.

The case, held in the Special Federal Court on 6 March 1964, was complicated. In 1923 only one plate, for the front of the car, was issued and the regulations governing these plates were subsequently repealed in 1935. The 1923 plate was issued by the Police Commissioner not the Motor Transport Commissioner. However, plates back and front were later mandated and the court took the view that "one of the plates – the one at the back presumably" was the Motor

Transport Commissioner's property. Ray's solicitor argued that Mr Neely had been asked to surrender 77 888 under the new regulations and the summons referred to more than one number plate. The application by the Department was dismissed.

Both the 'The Sydney Morning Herald, and 'The Telegraph' on 7 March 1964 reported the case. Ray was quoted, "I thought it a pity to surrender the plates that had been on the car for 40 years just for the sake of uniformity." Subsequently Motor Transport Commissioner Walsh said officers of his department were "human". When an interviewer expressed surprise, Mr Walsh modified his claim to the extent of saying, "Well, half human".







Criteria for Celebration of Marque or Club Anniversaries at the Shannons Sydney Classic

In recent years the number of display cars at the SSC has steadily increased, and as such the number of spaces available for celebration of marque or club anniversaries is now at a premium.

For this reason the Committee recently held a lengthy discussion around setting the criteria for celebrating these anniversaries at the Shannons Sydney Classic.

The Committee has endorsed the following criteria for all clubs/marques to follow.

If you have a celebration due at this year's SSC would you please let us know ASAP by emailing to: secretary@councilofmotorclubs.org.au

Anniversaries of Clubs:

5 years for first time anniversary, then in 10-year intervals. i.e. 10, 20, 30 etc.

Major motoring events and vehicle models in time intervals of 10 years or multiples thereof.

Celebration of an event should only be for major milestones such as:

1st Australian GP

1st Redex trial or Round Australia Trial

Opening of 1st Holden body works

1st Sydney to Melbourne journey by car

Vehicle model anniversaries to include:-

Release of a new model name (excluding a series No. Such as "XJ6 series 3", "First Mustang but not the fourth version")

Release of a model upgrade which includes a significant body remodelling or design (Spitfire 4 or MGB GT may qualify)

Release of a significant and innovative technological upgrade (Skyline GTR would qualify as distinct from early variations to the original Datsun Skyline)


Release of a model variation which had a major impact on Australian motoring events or history (Ford Falcon GT, Pontiac GTO instead or Mini Cooper S would fall under this category).





1947 Talbot Lago T26

A stunning 1947 Talbot Lago T26 that has been making the rounds at concours events these last few years was named Best of Show at 2013 Boca Raton Concours d'Elegance. Designed and crafted by flamboyant French coachbuilders Figoni et Falaschi, the Talbot Lago was originally owned by noted Hollywood director George Sidney, then Pebble Beach Concours co-chairman Lorin Tryon. Currently owned by Jim Patterson, it has more recently won a Best in Class and the Elegance in Motion awards at Pebble Beach in 2003 and Best Post-War European Open Car at the Amelia Island Concours in 2004.

Its grille is reminiscent of a 1940 Buick; the long, flowing lines of the body are simply spectacular, as is the two-tone blue color combination, which enhances its curving, yet elegant shape. 


