## MINUTES of COUNCIL of MOTOR CLUBS INC. - GENERAL MEETING

Kay explained they had voted at the Committee Meeting and introduced Boyd Symington as the new CMC President, and Tony O'Donnell is our new Vice President, both voted in unanimously. ### **3. BUSINESS ARISING FROM GENERAL Meeting Minutes of 25<sup>th</sup> November 2025:**

Boyd thanked all who attended Terry Thompson's funeral, either in person or via live stream. He reported there were over 300 people in attendance, and over 200 attended the wake. He also told the meeting that CMC had paid for the wake at Gymea Tradies, as a Thank You to Terry and Sharon.

Boyd explained that he has been the 2<sup>nd</sup> Responsible Person for CVS for some years now, and has filled in behind the scenes allowing Terry to have holidays, and spend time with family. In mid-December Terry had passed the CVS processing over to him. Boyd explained that as the Bexley PO Box was actually Terry & Sharons private mail address, and to save him an hour's round trip each day to collect the mail, CVS now has a new mailing address: **CMC CVS, PO Box 204, Engadine NSW 2233**. He also stated CMC has paid for a 12-month redirect on the old Bexley address, to allow time for everyone to get used to the change.

Boyd also noted it would be a quick meeting as we had the Volunteer of the Year Awards and collection of the SSC forms to do as well.
